David Theobald '98 on Receiving the First Kinnick Scholarship

s the first in his family to attend a fouryear college, **David Theobald '98** was applying for any scholarship he could find at the University of Iowa. He stumbled upon a new one called the Nile C. Kinnick Scholarship, offered by Phi Kappa Psi. David applied, got to know Iowa Alpha's recruitment leaders over the summer, and the rest was history.

David not only became a Phi Psi Brother, but he was the first recipient of the Kinnick Scholarship, which earned him \$500 to help with textbooks. "It was a great way to get incoming freshmen interested in the Greek system and to market the Fraternity," David said. "The scholarship was proof of Iowa Alpha's strong stance on being good students in addition to having fun, which was super important to me."

ROOM TO GROW

UI was much bigger than David's high school, and going through recruitment and joining Phi Psi seemed like the best way to broaden his social circle. He was right: while David was already confident in the classroom, the brotherhood helped improve his social skills and networking capabilities.

"At the time it was a fairly small Chapter, and it felt like a place where I could immediately get involved and make a difference—both in the Fraternity and the broader Iowa Greek community," he said.

STILL RISING TO THE CHALLENGE

Professionally, David has been in the IT field for approximately 22 years from consulting to developing, product management, and more. He's spent over 15 of those years at Akamai Technologies, where he is currently a director of product management.

"We design, build, and deploy cutting-edge technology to help our customers provide their end users with top performance and security," he explained. "Akamai serves over 30% of the world's internet traffic! It's very nerdy but addictingly challenging work at a global scale."

Becoming Like Nile 2023 Kinnick Scholarship Awarded to 15 Students

n May 2023, **Ben Hill '22**, **Charlie Doubet '22**, and **John Barton '21** embarked on a mission to find exceptional leaders, athletes, and scholars honoring **Nile Kinnick '38**, a celebrated Brother of Phi Kappa Psi. The committee received 508 applications and conducted 494 interviews from June through early August, ultimately selecting 68 semi-finalists to move to a second round of interviews, traveling across Illinois and Iowa and accommodating virtual meetings when needed.

Iowa Alpha's fall semester began with the 27th annual Nile C. Kinnick Scholarship Award Ceremony. After careful deliberation, the finalists were awarded a total of \$15,000 in scholarship funds ranging from \$500 to \$2,500. The brunch event on August 20 recognized 15 incoming UI freshmen who embody Brother Kinnick's qualities: academic excellence, discipline, integrity, and service to others.

The award ceremony was a great success, featuring guest speakers **Michael Doty '10** and UI Professor Dan Matheson along with UI staffers and Iowa's IFC and FSL members. Professor Matheson reflected on his time in the professional sports world and shared his five keys to success. Brother Doty shared a about his life, Phi Psi experience, and the legacy Nile Kinnick left within the Iowa community and our brotherhood.

Our service as coordinators was rewarding, imparting valuable lessons in time management and adaptability. Balancing the number of interviews per day, setting realistic expectations for the duration, and adhering to the schedule ensured fairness and efficiency.

Thank you for entrusting us with this responsibility. We are honored to help broaden the meaningful impact of Iowa Alpha and perpetuate the important legacy of Nile C. Kinnick.

Employing an experiential education approach, the exec board engaged in and reflected upon each challenge to foster unity and practice vulnerability. The evening concluded with a vision-planning session at City Park, charting Iowa Alpha's course for the upcoming year over steaks and salmon.

From the day's activities and discussions, leadership is focused on improving in these areas:

- *Recruitment and Brotherhood:* Phi Psi is dedicated to strengthening the brotherhood through strategic recruitment from IFC and to the Nationals Headquarters, building upon its strong legacy.
- *Career Advancement:* Older members are seeking expanded opportunities outside the Chapter through career-oriented connections or study-abroad opportunities. Our Speaker Series has been a great way to build connections with alumni. - *Meeting Decorum, Member Retention, and Chapter Expectations:* A change in billing service providers (and lingering COVID habits) has made reestablishing Chapter

governance practices and policies a top priority to enhance accountability.

• *Philanthropy:* Dance Marathon, Boys and Girls Club, and Students Care are the philanthropic priorities of the Chapter. There is an expanded vision to grow philanthropic efforts and surpass historically great funding goals.

Our House Corporation members met following the Kinnick Scholarship Brunch. We uphold our responsibility to keep the Chapter House in good condition, and with the summer's updates, we think you'll agree it's the best on campus. We've tackled the following initiatives this summer:

- Upgraded alumni communications to continue the lifelong brotherhood.
- Enhanced live-in check-in/check-out processes, including mandatory security deposits.
- Executed general maintenance repairs on doors, alarms, and sprinkler systems to successfully pass city fire and rental inspection.
- Awarded funding to newly announced Kinnick Scholarship recipients.
